Supracondylar Humerus Fracture

Goals

- You have elected to participate in an ABOS approved practice improvement module (PIM) that will allow you to reflect on your care of patients with **supracondylar humerus fracture**, compare your treatment with other Board certified orthopaedic surgeons, and develop an action plan to improve the care of your patients.

PIM

- The goal of Part II of MOC is to help you assess your **Performance in Practice**
- The ideal PIM allows you to review an aspect of your own practice, compare how you are doing with your peers, educate yourself about best practices, develop and implement a plan to improve, and reassess at a later date

- For this module, you will **select 10 consecutive patients** that you treated for **supracondylar humerus fracture**
- You will be asked to **audit patient records and enter the data** requested in the web-based ABOS data reporting system (SCRIBE)
- After you have completed the data entry you will be given **feedback** that compares your treatment with the treatment rendered by the other orthopaedic surgeons participating in this PIM

- Click a Case # to begin entering data for a patient.
- The data you enter will automatically be saved when you navigate from one page to the next throughout the case.
- On the main MOC-PIM page a red X will appear to the right of each incomplete case.
- A green checkmark will appear to the right of each complete case.

- After you have reviewed your results and compared your treatment with the treatment rendered by other orthopaedic surgeons you will be asked to develop an **Action Plan** to improve the care of your patients and report the plan in SCRIBE

- At a future **Supracondylar Humerus Fracture** PIM you will be able to track the results of any changes you implement
- Finally, the American Board of Orthopaedic Surgery would like to solicit your input on the PIM

- In order to earn the 20 SAE credits for this PIM you must complete the entry of 10 cases, assess your practice, and enter the second set of 10 cases.
- Partial SAE credits will not be given.

- By participating in MOC and completing the PIM you have demonstrated your commitment to lifelong learning and the protection of the public by continuously elevating the standard of patient care.
